Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture was written to commemorate Russia's defence of its motherland against Napoleon's invading Grande Armée in 1812.

<i>Vaughan Williams</i>	Five Variants of Dives and Lazarus
<i>Dvořák</i>	Serenade for Winds
<i>Dvořák</i>	Symphony No.7

Five Variants of Dives and Lazarus is a work for harp and string orchestra, based on a folk tune. Vaughan Williams composed the work on commission from the British Council to be played at the 1939 World's Fair in New York City.

Dvořák's Serenade for Winds evokes the atmosphere of the musical performances in Baroque castles, where the worlds of the aristocracy and the common folk merged. His Symphony No.7 is characteristic for its dramatic expression and sombre atmosphere of uncertainty and defiance. It is a profoundly intimate work where the composer ponders the meanderings of his soul and the answers to elementary issues of human existence.

Shostakovich's fizzing Festive Overture was written in 3 days but became an instant hit in and outside Russia. The brilliant St Albans-based pianist, composer and conductor, Alissa Firsova, is the soloist in Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto No 1 – one of his best-known works. Stravinsky based his ballet The Firebird on a Russian folk tale about an evil demon who has 13 princesses under his spell. It is the work that elevated him to international fame.

Tom Hammond became Principal Conductor of SASO in 2016, and holds positions of Music Director with Hertford SO, Essex SO and Yorkshire Young Sinfonia. He also guests with many other orchestras, including the Ernest Read SO, London's Sinfonia Tamesa and the Palestine Youth Orchestra.

Tom founded the Hertfordshire Festival of Music in 2016, is a recording producer for Chiaro Audio, and leads workshops with young people, including for the Britten Sinfonia and the Ingenium Academy International Summer School, Winchester.

The first ever Junior Fellow in Conducting at Trinity Laban Conservatoire (2006–08), Tom was selected and mentored by Sir Charles Mackerras, especially in developing his operatic repertoire.

Recent concerts have included appearances with Stephen Hough (piano), Emma Johnson (clarinet), Robert Murray (tenor), Ray Chen (violin) and Daniel Pailthorpe (flute).

Tom was a prize winner at the 2009 Leeds Conductors' Competition and made an Associate of the Royal Academy of Music in 2010.
